Ambon Scripture Engagement

The Ambonese Malay New Testament has been published and was officially launched in September 2022! But publication is not the end of this story. God has brought together an enthusiastic team of local Scripture engagement workers to promote the new translation and help people to use it and apply it in their lives.

The Ambonese Scripture Engagement team is passionate about seeing God's Word at work among the people of the Maluku Islands. The team is highly sought after for their training workshops that are designed to meet the needs of local churches. Topics include trauma healing parenting, overcoming addiction, using local language in ministry and conflict resolution.

At each workshop, the team teaches, prays and leads worship in Ambonese Malay, enabling participants to experience the impact of God's Word in their own language. An important part of their work during 2023 will be running a series of workshops to introduce the newly published Ambonese Malay New Testament to churches and showing how it can be used in teaching and discipleship.
