Praise and Prayer Points. Did you know?

In the late 1980's and into the 1990's banners became very popular and were hung in churches across the country.

The Drummoyne church congregation had some gifted young Mums who created some amazing banners during that time and often the Sunday School children were involved in



the making of them. The Five Dock congregation also had some gifted banner makers.

On Pentecost Sunday, 26th May, 1996, the Rotuman Fellowship officially became the third Congregation of our Parish at a combined Service held in the Drummoyne Church and this was followed by a shared meal.

Our Parish Secretary at the time, Fay Hunt, recorded in the 1996 Annual Report: "This was indeed a time of celebration and we give thanks to God that after months of planning and backed by prayer that the longings of the Fellowship to become a Congregation became a reality".

This special day deserved some creativity and Helene Forsyth with the help of others designed and made the banner (photographed) which now hangs in the Five Dock Church.

The predominant beige to brown coloured fabrics symbolised our diverse skin tones and backgrounds, some patterns depicted Creation, the various widths from children to adults and the flow from dark up to light was to remind us of how God's love has brought us from the depths of darkness in to His wonderful Light.

You will notice that there are three separate banners and on the day, the Sunday School children from the three congregations brought the three banners forward and they were placed on the rod and then symbolically joined together with the cross, a constant reminder of God's unifying and great love in Christ.
