MORE THAN JUST BEACH MISSIONS

"Let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfector of our Faith."

Hebrews 12:1b

In churches it has been usual to hear about Scripture Union Beach Missions held during the summer when families settled into a beach holiday. These Beach Missions share fun and family friendly activities sharing God's Good News of Jesus with holiday makers. Scripture Union however is more than Beach Missions.

SU camps are run across NSW during school holidays. Campers learn about Jesus while participating in a range of activities around a theme, such as Fishing and Diving or Rugby League "the boys left energised with new rugby skills and a deeper understanding of what it means to be a follower of Jesus", Ride Like a Girl Camp "we had lots of returning riders including many accompanied by their younger sisters. Those attending learnt what it means to be a maturing Christian from the story of Joseph focusing on forgiveness".

SU school groups, SUPA clubs in Primary and ISCF for an older age group provide face to face opportunities for young people to ask big questions and hear the message of truth in the Gospel. Motivated by her love for Jesus, one young leader says "if you simply give your time and love them they might just keep coming to hear more.....then you get the privilege of witnessing God do his powerful work in their hearts."

School can be a challenging context for Christian students to keep shining brightly for Jesus. In most schools they experience some pushback and they may even be tempted to give up on their faith.

Pray: For the young people who witness to others their love for Jesus. Give them courage and keep their faith strong.
